Liverpool:
Writing, Place and Culture

Programme Outline

This International Summer School offers an insight into the history and culture of Liverpool and its surrounding region. Liverpool John Moores University is based in the heart of Liverpool. The course aims to provide an overview of Liverpool's history in literature, and in music, film texts, and popular culture.

The Summer School focuses on the significance of geographical and historical context for the production of literature and cultural outputs. Place-writing, cultural history and psychogeography underpin our approach more broadly, with opportunities to explore literary landscapes beyond Liverpool.

Students will take part in a diverse range of visits to the city's cultural highlights including the Walker Art Gallery, The Cavern Club, the Beatles Museum, and Liverpool's Maritime Museum.

Students will be able to understand the significance of the cultural and textual history of Liverpool, discuss works by a range of key authors and make connections between cultural production and historical-geographical context.
